NCEASL- National Council Evangelical Alliance of Sri Lanka Young Ambassadors Programme

The first training of the NCEASL 'Young Ambassadors Programme' was completed mid July. 60 young people from across the island participated in this

programme designed to bridge the gap between the Tamil and Sinhalese communities after three decades of bitter conflict. Follow up mentoring and support with the participants will continue regularly before they meet as a group again on a peace work camp which is scheduled to be held in October. In addition to this YPA programme are currently working on a human rights book in both languages. This book will be printed soon and they expect to distribute as part of their awareness and training gatherings in the districts.

Micah triennial Global Consultation on Creation Stewardship and Climate Change.

Climate change and its impact on natural resources, the poor, food scarcity, water and migration contributes to local and national conflict and violence as communities, particularly in the Global South compete for scarce resources and face its impact. Our understanding of this issue as Christian Peace-Makers is important and needs to be taken seriously.

The Micah triennial Global Consultation on Creation Stewardship and Climate Change just held in Nairobi, Kenya considered Climate Change from a development perspective and the impact it is placing on poor and vulnerable 'at risk' communities. If you hadn't considered the link between Climate Change and Conflict, have read through the material from the conference and be better equipped.

Book Review: 'The Peacemaking Pastor' Alfred Poirer; Baker Books 2006

Every pastor faces conflict in the church, and Alfred Poirier has this loving reminder: we can run, but we can't hide. Jesus set the example as the Incarnate Peacemaker, and Scripture clearly calls his servant-pastors to be ministers of reconciliation. So the issue is not whether to be a mediator but what kind of mediator to be.

Thoroughly exploring the theology of reconciliation, Poirier adds lessons from personal experience and lists practical steps for effective mediation. With this comprehensive guide, you can embrace peacemaking confidently as a way to glorify God through the overcoming power of the gospel.
